After graduating from UW-Madison Farm & Industry Short Course Program, Mike returned to the family farm near Chili, WI. His passion was to raise and produce quality hogs, and he did so under the farm names of Lindys Durocs and DoMil Hamps. He exhibited his hogs at numerous local, regional, state, and national shows, including the National Barrow Show, National Type Conference, and the World Pork Expo. His breeding decisions created numerous Grand Champions across the country, including five entries into the Wisconsin State Fair Governor's Blue-Ribbon Auction and the 1988 Champion Duroc Production Barrow at the National Barrow Show. In 2002, Mike & his wife, Donna, were named Master Seedstock Producers by the Wisconsin Livestock Breeders, and in 2004, they were inducted into the Wisconsin Pork Producers Hall of Fame. Mike was dedicated to youth through his service as a 4-H leader and mentor. He thoroughly enjoyed sharing his wisdom and knowledge of raising and showing hogs as a county fair livestock judge. He was a lifetime member of the Marshfield FFA Alumni, WI FFA Alumni, and National FFA Alumni. Mike was also a member of the WI Livestock Breeders Association, serving as a board member and their president.

Mike and Donna's youngest daughter, Karlene Lindow-Krueger, was an extraordinary, agricultural enthusiast. She was a strong supporter of livestock families. She served on numerous livestock boards and was a leader of the WI Show Pig Association and the Campbellsport 4-H Club. She was a county fair livestock judge and judge of National FFA applications. She was the very first female to earn the National FFA American Star Farmer Award in 2002, and her FFA jacket now hangs in the Smithsonian of American History in Washington, DC. She was a member of the Campbellsport FFA Alumni, WI FFA Alumni, and the National FFA Alumni.
